To Whom it May Concern:

Per "Carrier Information Guide. Documentary Requirements for Travel" of May 2014:

1. A Lawful Permanent Resident (LPR) may travel to the United States with a Permanent Resident Card (Form I-551). LPR's with expired I-551's may be boarded without penalty provided the card was issued with a 10-year expiration date. A passport is not required. (page 36)
2. Conditional Resident with an expired Resident card (with a two-year expiration date) may be boarded if also in possession of a Notice of Action (Form I-797). The Notice of Action extends the validity of the card for a specified length of time, generally one year. The "Receipt Date" of the form has no effect on the validity of the card. A passport is not required. (page 38)
