The U.S. Government is continuing to closely monitor events and carefully assess conditions in Ukraine. The safety and security of U.S. citizens overseas and their immediate family members remain our top priority.

U.S. citizens and Lawful Permanent Residents still in Ukraine should immediately depart Ukraine by any means possible. U.S. citizens in Ukraine should be aware that the U.S. government is not able to evacuate U.S. citizens from within Ukraine. Please see links below for detailed information:

STEP enrollment gives you the latest security updates and makes it easier for the U.S. Embassy to contact you in an emergency.

#### U.S. IMMIGRANT VISA INFORMATION

Immigrant Visa (IV) cases that were already approved and pending with U.S. Embassy Kyiv have been automatically transferred to the U.S. Consulate General in Frankfurt, Germany – the primary consulate handing all Kyiv IV cases. Please

If both the petitioner and applicant(s) are physically present in Slovakia please contact BratislavalV@state.gov to discuss your options.

If you are a U.S. citizen with a Ukrainian fiancée/fiancé in SLOVAKIA seeking to travel to the United States on a K-1 visa:

You *must have* an approved I-129F from United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) before applying for a K-1 visa at a U.S. embassy or consulate abroad. If you filed an I-129F petition with USCIS that has not yet been approved, you can request an expedite for USCIS processing at <a href="https://www.uscis.gov/forms/filing-guidance/how-to-make-an-expedite-request">https://www.uscis.gov/forms/filing-guidance/how-to-make-an-expedite-request</a>.

U.S. consulates and embassies are not authorized to accept locally filed I-129F petitions.

If you are a U.S. citizen seeking to file an I-130 on behalf of your IMMEDIATE FAMILY ONLY (spouse, children, or parents):

If you have not yet filed an I-130 petition but wish to do so, you may contact U.S. Consulate General Frankfurt at <a href="mailto:frnuscisinquiries@state.gov">frnuscisinquiries@state.gov</a> to request local filing in Frankfurt. Please note that Frankfurt is only accepting I-130 petitions **filed by U.S. citizens on behalf of their spouse, child(ren) (under age 21) or parent(s)**.

Both the petitioner and the applicant(s) must be physically present in Germany. In extremely urgent circumstances, U.S. Consular Section Bratislava will consider accepting local filing. Contact <a href="mailto:BratislavalV@state.gov">BratislavalV@state.gov</a> to discuss your case.

**IMPORTANT NOTE:** IV applications can take 1-2 weeks or longer to process. Applicants must be prepared to financially support their stay while in Slovakia, including all required visa fees, mandatory medical exam fees, lodging and transportation costs, etc. **The Embassy does NOT provide financial assistance to IV applicants.** 

#### **NONIMMIGRANT VISAS**

Before applying for a nonimmigrant visa (NIV), consider carefully whether you are qualified for the visa you intend to apply for. Nonimmigrant visas are for **temporary stays** in the United States and <u>are not for refugees</u>. There are no nonimmigrant visas for refugees. <u>If you apply for a nonimmigrant visa but do not</u> intend to leave the United States, your application will be refused.

## ALL VISA FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE, regardless of outcome.

# REFUGEE, ASYLUM AND HUMANITARIAN PAROLE

The U.S. Embassy in Bratislava does not process applications for U.S. refugees.

- There are no visas for refugees for travel to the United States.
- You cannot claim asylum from outside the United States.
